Where's the Game Room??!?!


Hal's Place—The Gaming Oasis is in the Plaza Meeting Room, located next door to our main event space.

The Contact Award

In 2007, Farpoint created the Volker-McChesney Award to honor Baltimore area fans who have exemplified service to the fandom community. The award was named for two past Farpoint Chairs, Beverly J. Volker and Marion McChesney, lynchpins of local fan activity who had been instrumental in the creation of Baltimore area conventions and fanzines. The award recognizes long-term contributions in convention or club organizing, writing, artwork, filmmaking, filking or other creative or service endeavor. It says that the recipient has shaped our local fandom in an unforgettable way. Current Farpoint Committee Members may not receive the award (although that rule was bent by the forces of darkness in 2018). Recipients are selected by the Farpoint Foundation Board and members of the Volker Family (Marion's fandom family.)

With the passing of another Farpoint Chair, Sandra Zier-Teitler in 2021, we have decided to rename our award in honor, not just of those fandom pioneers, but of the spirit that motivated them to work tirelessly, sometimes thanklessly, for fandom. The team behind Farpoint has traded under many names, but the name under which it all began seems most appropriate. In 1975, Beverly Volker and her sister Nancy Kippax started a fanzine called *Contact*, explaining that that term defined the goal of the U.S.S. Enterprise's explorations, of our need to seek out and embrace fandom, to discover the difference in others, and "to delight in that difference and understand that, although it exists, there are levels on which [we] can relate."

Contact quickly grew to include in its stable some of the most talented writers and artists in fandom. It also developed new zine editors and publishers like Sandy and Marion. The "Contact Crowd" provided key support to the committee for the early Shore Leave conventions, and then started running their own conventions in 1984. And so, for Bev, for Marion, for Nancy and for Sandy, we proudly announce the Contact Award, which honors each of them, and the spirit and gifts they shared with us all.



Our 2024 Contact Award Recipient is Chris Carothers

Chris is familiar to Farpoint Attendees as the host of Vic's Place Karaoke and the Ten Forward dance party. Chris and his late partner Lee Warren, together with their incredible team, have been lighting up the late nights at Farpoint for decades now. Chris has a knack for making whatever he works on easier and better. He goes out of his way to help other fans, and puts his whole heart (and his considerable skills) into the effort.

Chris is also an active participant in the local theater community, having been featured most recently in Laurel Mill Theater's production of *Hellbent*. And of course he's familiar to Prometheus Radio Theatre's audiences from many hilarious performances at Farpoint's opening ceremonies. A loyal member of Starfleet, Chris has served as the XO of the U.S.S. *Richthofen*, and contributed significantly to the U.S.S. *Athena*. If he had a mundane life--which he does not!--Chris would pose as a mild-mannered medical assistant.


Keith R.A. DeCandido has written novels, short fiction, and comic



Cal Dodd

Cathal J. "Cal" Dodd is an Irish-Canadian voice actor and singer best known to several generations of fans for his portrayal of the Marvel Comics character Wolverine in *X-Men: The Animated Series* and the Marvel vs Capcom series of video games.

Born in Dublin, Cal moved with his family from Ireland to Port Dover, Ontario, where he grew up. His mother was a music teacher at Port Dover Public School. Music ran in their family as Cal performed in a 1970's rock band called Déjà Vu and his younger brother is rock vocalist/vocal actor Rory Dodd.

Cal recorded music with producer Bob Hahn in Canada, which consisted of demos and material to be submitted to major labels. His recordings ended up on the RCA label, with a full-length album release *New Horizons* on Hahn's own Rising Records label in 1975. From 1978 to 1983 he co-hosted the Canadian TV series *Circus* on CTV with Sherisse Laurence.

Cal's voice acting career spans five decades and includes his role as the hero/villain Random Virus in the BBC series *Ace Lightning* and stints on every-thing from *Fraggle Rock* and *Goosebumps* to *Rescue Rangers* and *Paw Patrol* and a slew of video games.

Cal will be reprising his role of Wolverine in the upcoming Disney+ series *X-Men '97* alongside fellow returning fan favorites George Buza (Beast), Catherine Disher (Jean Grey), Adrian Hough (Nightcrawler), Chris Potter (Gambit), Alison Sealy-Smith (Storm), and Lenore Zann (Rogue). *X-Men '97* is due to release later this year.





Currently, I am a NASA employee, continuing my work in space weather. Through-out my education, I have been lucky to work at NASA JPL looking at Uranus's moons and studying Saturn on the Cassini mission at the South West Research Institute. Today I stick a bit closer to home sticking to trying to better understand the Earth's magnetic field and its space weather phenomena.

Tom Hill started saying he wanted to be an aerospace engineer when he was six. Alive but not aware for Apollo, he grew up reading the sto-



ries of Apollo and of science fiction, knowing he wanted to work on spacecraft. After high school, he attended Penn State University on an Air Force Reserve Officer Training Corps scholarship and graduated with a degree in aerospace engineering. Called to active duty in 1991, his first assignment was at Schriever (then Falcon) Air Force Base in Colorado Springs. There he worked on military weather and missile warning satellites and helped get 13 of the original operational 24 Global Positioning System (GPS) satellites into orbit.

His next assignment took him to Turkey, where he used RADAR to track satellites for Cheyenne Mountain. Serving there for a year, he tracked several space shuttle missions to the Russian space station Mir and even tracked the oldest object still in orbit, Vanguard 1.

After Turkey, he went to Vandenberg Air Force Base to work in launch. He served as the launch controller for a weather satellite, sitting in the last on-site blockhouse in the Air Force as a Titian II lifted off the pad. He assisted with other launches including a Delta II rocket and a Titan IV.

At this point he was married with a kid on the way, so Tom separated from the Air Force and went to work in the aerospace industry. He stayed in the Air Force Reserve, assigned parttime to two positions at the Pentagon and retired in 2014 as a Lieutenant Colonel. At his new company he worked with a new version of a weather satellite called the Geostationary Operational Environmental Satellite or GOES, being involved in the system from a critical design review through serving as a test director for the on-orbit satellite. He also worked with two land survey satellites called LandSats 5 and 7. One was launched in 1984 and served for 28 years. The other had launched in 1999 (while Tom was at Vandenberg) and was going strong as well. His work has involved international cooperation for an early form of space traffic control, early efforts for NASA's space asset protection, and reviews of several spacecraft in their design process.

He has degrees in linguistics from the Santa Cruz and Berkeley campuses of the University of California and has conducted linguistic research as a postdoctoral fellow at the Smithsonian Institution in Washington, D.C. He is an associate producer of the documentary *Conlanging: The Art* of *Crafting Tongues*.







Farpoint Rules and Policies

Convention Attendance:

- Farpoint is a public event and will take place regardless of weather or travel conditions. Convention
 membership tickets are non-refundable. Attendees may re-sell or gift tickets privately, with notice to
 Farpoint of the registration name change.
- Seating is on a first-come, first-served basis in all programming rooms. There is disabled Attendee and VIP (Guests and Staff) seating sections available in the ballroom. Please observe all reserved signs for these seats.
- 3. Purchase of a convention membership ticket does not guarantee a Guest's autograph. Attendees are responsible for attending the scheduled autograph session(s) to secure a Guest's autograph.
- 4. You must wear your Farpoint badge to gain admittance to all convention areas. Badges are nontransferable. Lost badges will be replaced for a \$20.00 fee with proper photo identification.

Hotel:

- Causing a disruption in any part of the hotel (rooms or convention areas) is grounds for expulsion without a refund from the convention. Farpoint and the DoubleTree Hotel has sole discretion in determining the severity of the disruption.
- Smoking is prohibited in the hotel (tobacco products, e-cigarettes and vaping). Attendees should use designated smoking areas on the lobby level outside the hotel, which comply with Maryland requirements that smoking areas be 15 feet away from building entrances/exits.

Conduct:

- 1. Farpoint does not tolerate harassment of Attendees, Staff, Vendors/Dealers or Guests by any other Attendee, Staff, Vendor/Dealer or Guest. This includes, but is not limited to:
 - a. Stalking
 - b. Intimidation
 - c. Offensive Verbal Comments
 - d. Physical Harassment and/or Unwelcome Physical Touching or Attention
 - e. Symbols or Statements of hate toward, but not limited to, a person's Race, Color, National Origin, Gender, Sexual Orientation, Age, Body Size, Disability, Appearance or Religion
- 2. The above harassing actions, symbols and/or statements are also not permitted as part of a presentation, panel, exhibit, show or cosplay. Farpoint in its sole discretion will determine if a harassing action or statement has occurred or symbol has been used. Farpoint Staff will take prompt action in any form deemed appropriate toward anyone found in violation of this policy, which can range from asking an Attendee, Staff or Guest to leave the convention floor for a specified time up to expulsion from Farpoint Convention with no refund or a lifetime ban from the convention or calling for police assistance.
- 3. Any Attendee, Staff, Vendor/Dealer or Guest experiencing an uncomfortable or unsafe situation is asked to bring the matter to the nearest Farpoint Staff member, identified by their convention badge. They will be escorted to the convention operations office to make an official report. Attendees, Staff, Vendors/Dealers and Guests may also go directly to the convention operations office, located in the Boardroom on the second floor, as circumstances dictate. After making a report, Farpoint Staff will contact local law enforcement or medical assistance, provide an escort, offer a safe place and/or otherwise assist the Attendee, Staff, Vendor/Dealer or Guest to feel safe for the remainder of the convention.
- 4. Convention Staff, Guests and Attendees are expected to follow Maryland's Indecent Exposure Laws. Clothing and costumes must fully cover their private parts. This law does not apply to mothers breast-feeding a child. Overtly sexual imagery and language is also not appropriate in programs, except during events or panels specified as covering adult topics that are open only to Attendees over 18 years of age. Attendees violating these rules may be expelled from Farpoint without a refund at the discretion of the co-chairs and/or committee.
- 5. Convention Staff, Guests and Attendees are expected to follow Maryland's Drug and Alcohol Abuse laws. The drinking age in Maryland is 21. Violation of these laws will result in immediate expulsion from the convention. The DoubleTree Hotel requires all alcohol consumed in the bar, restaurant or convention space be served by hotel employees. Outside purchase alcohol must be consumed in the privacy of the Attendee's room.
- 6. Parents are responsible for the behavior of their minor children. If a child is seen behaving in a disruptive manner or in a way that might cause harm to themselves or others, Farpoint reserves the right to ask that the parent accompany the child when in convention areas.
- 7. Attendees should be aware that convention activities are often videotaped or photographed by other Attendees and the press. The photographer should ask for your permission prior to taping or photographing you at the convention. Attendees should be aware that they may appear in the background of someone else's video or photo and are responsible for notifying that photographer if they do not wish to be included in the image.
- 8. Celebrity Guests' contracts may prohibit videotaping of their stage appearance. An announcement will be made from the stage prior to the celebrity's appearance. Videotaping of other programming events is subject to the approval of the convention and person(s) on stage.
- 9. Video and still cameras may not be used to capture images in the Art Show or Dealers Rooms.

- 10. Requesting a Guest's personal information is considered a privacy violation and is grounds for expulsion from the convention. Examples include an Attendee asking a Guest for their hotel room number, travel itinerary or other contact information that the Guest considers private.
- 11. On-stage presentations of gifts or awards to or by any Attendee or Guest must be pre-approved by the Farpoint Convention chairs. Making a presentation without this approval is grounds for expulsion from the convention.
- 12. No gunplay or swordplay is allowed at any time unless it is taking place at a demonstration event scheduled by the convention. All weapons must remain holstered or sheathed. Staff members may ask to inspect your weapon to verify it is a prop. When this happens, your weapon will be marked with a removable marker, such as a zip tie, to identify that the inspection has occurred. Items considered weapons include but are not limited to paint ball or splatter guns; prop, blank or cap guns; laser tag guns; swords, lightsabers and similar articles with edges, blades and/or projectile capability. Laser target designators or laser pointers are not allowed in the convention areas (except as used by Guest speakers during a presentation) as they can cause injury if not used properly.

Service Animals and Pets:



- The DoubleTree Hotel allows pets in the sleeping rooms per their policy. This policy limits Hotel Guests to 1 pet per room (pet maximum weight 50 pounds) with a non-refundable \$75 fee per stay. The animal must not be left unsupervised in the sleeping room or the convention levels and must be on a leash when not in the sleeping room.
- 2. Animals are not allowed on the convention levels except for Americans With Disabilities Act (ADA) service animals. Service animals must be leashed and always wear proper identifying tag, collar or vest on the convention floor. The ADA allows for trained service animals to accompany their matched partner in a place of business. Per the ADA, service animals are:
 - a. Individually trained animals matched with a specific disabled person to perform assistance tasks for that person; and
 - b. Working animals, not pets.
- 3. The following animals are not considered service animals per the ADA and are not allowed on the convention floor:
 - a. Household pets; and
 - b. Animals used for emotional support or easing anxiety.
 - In contrast with the Federal ADA laws, Maryland has modified the state ADA laws to allow service animals in training similar access to public spaces that is provided to fully trained service animals. However, both the Federal and Maryland ADA laws allow public events and spaces to ask for a service animal or service animal in training to be removed if said animal is not behaving in accordance with their training.
- 5. All service animals and service animals in training on the convention floor are expected and required by law to behave in accordance with their training. Farpoint and the DoubleTree Hotel will request the animal be removed if an animal becomes disruptive to the proceedings, to include (but not limited to) the following:
 - a. Barking, growling, biting, or snapping at Attendees, Staff, Vendors/Dealers, Guests or other Service Animals.
 - b. Jumping on or knocking over Attendees, Staff, Vendors/Dealers, Guests or other Service Animals.
 - c. Knocking over, chewing on or otherwise damaging hotel or convention floors, furniture, equipment, displays and signage belonging to the Hotel, Farpoint Convention, Guests, Vendors/Dealers, Exhibitors or other Attendees.
 - d. Urinating or defecating on hotel or convention floors, furniture, equipment, displays and signage belonging to the Hotel, Farpoint Convention, Guests, Vendors/Dealers, Exhibitors or other Attendees.
 - e. Running loose on the convention floor and otherwise not staying with their matched partner while attending the convention.

Federal and Maryland ADA laws do not apply to Search and Rescue (SAR) animals in training. A SAR animal is trained in public at either organized training events or only after permission is granted by the owners of the public premises for the training to take place. The DoubleTree hotel will not grant such permission unless the public event is a SAR training event or demonstration, which Farpoint Convention is not.

- 7. The reserved seating area for disabled Attendees in the Preakness Ballroom for main programming will include seats with enough floor space for an Attendee to keep their service animal safely next to them and out of the way of foot traffic. Attendees with service animals who do not utilize this reserved seating may be asked to re-locate to this specific area and/or leave the ballroom if the Attendee places their animal in a way that blocks foot traffic or causes a tripping hazard for Staff, Guests and Attendees.
- Anyone experiencing an issue with an animal in the convention areas is asked to go to the Con Operations office in the Boardroom on the second floor of the hotel, or the Registration Desk or Information Desk in the hotel lobby and ask for a convention chair to be contacted.
